Hot Weather

SLIP SLOP SLAP SEEK ad SLIDE!

Warm weather is about to begin and it is important that students are prepared for the heat. Time to ensure that your child is wearing their hat and sunscreen! Some students are already running out of water on warmer days and they are able to fill up their water bottles if required. Make sure your child has a big enough bottle and is easy to refill.

Slip on clothes that cover as much skin as possible.

Slop on broad spectrum, water resistant SPF 30 or higher sunscreen.

Slap on a broad brimmed hat or one that covers your head, face, neck and ears.

Seek shade, particularly over the middle of the day when UV is highest.

Slide on close fitting sunglasses.

Attendance

At Moulamein Public School, our attendance is something that we are trying to improve. Learning relies upon a consistent approach and turning up each day for further learning.

Please be aware that if your child is absent, the school must receive an explanation within 7 days after the absence. If no reason is received the absence will be marked as "unjustified". This is a requirement set down by the NSW Department of Education. It is also expected that students attend the last day of each term. If your child is not at school, they are not to enter the school grounds unless they are preparing to stay. Students should not be skating around the fence on a school day and waiting at the gates to play with attending students. If your child is not attending school they must remain in your care. Thank you for your assistance.

Swim Scheme



Our school will once again be running the School Swimming Scheme this term. The scheme is supported by the NSW Department of Education and provides substantial subsidy to the school. This enables us to offer some students the opportunity to participate in a basic life-saving swimming program. Not all students from K-6 will participate and it is important to remember that our swim scheme cannot replace swimming lessons offered at town leisure centres and professional swimming centres. These lessons offer students the chance to learn lifesaving skills and are always timely with the commencement of summer just around the corner.

Selective High School Applications for 2019

Selective high schools cater for the specific needs of high achieving gifted students who may otherwise be without sufficient classmates at their own academic and social level. We let all parents know about these opportunities, even though we do have any close to Moulamein Public School. Selective schools help gifted and talented students to learn by grouping them with other gifted and talented students, teaching them in specialised ways and providing educational materials at the appropriate level. Parents apply when the student is in Year 5. The students sit the test in March of Year 6.

To be considered for placement students must sit the Selective High School Placement Test. For information about applying and the placement process go to

Some selective high schools have vacancies in Years 8 to 12. Applications open in late June for placement the following year.
