## School Office Hours

The school office will be closed on Wednesdays. When the office is not open, the telephone is diverted to our mobile number, which will be checked during break times 11.00-11.30am & 1.00-1.45pm and again just prior to 3:00pm please leave a message.

Where possible, on an unmanned office day, parents are asked to notify the school of any variation to end of day routines via a written note to the class teacher in the morning. Telephone messages may not be received in time to deliver a message to a child prior to 3.00pm.

#### Visitors to the School

Anyone entering the school premises must SIGN IN and SIGN OUT so that we know who is on premises at all times. This is a Child Protection and Work Health & Safety requirement.

A 'visitor' is anyone entering our school grounds, including parents delivering items to children, parents picking or dropping off students, parent volunteers, community members, tradesmen and sales persons.

Sign In & Out at the school office or, on the day Rangi Needham, our General Assistant (GA) is the office is unmanned, follow directions posted on the office door. Thank you for your cooperation.

## **Arrival Times**

Any student arriving to school late (approximately 10min or more after bell) will need to *SIGN IN* at the office, and receive a **late notice** to hand to their class teacher. Teachers will direct students back to the office if a late slip has not been collected.

Students leaving school early will similarly need to **SIGN OUT.** Parents need to report to the office prior to collecting their child, and sign themselves **IN** and **OUT**, and collect a note to hand to the teacher when collecting their child. Please do not move directly to classrooms.

On the days the office is closed, Late Arrival / Early Departure slips can be obtained from the K/1 room.

#### **School Zones**

40km/h speed zones operate on all NSW gazetted school days, whether you can see children or not.

Signs and white *Dragon Teeth* road markings indicate that a vehicle is entering a 40km/h speed zone.

In addition, our school has a flagged School Crossing that signals students may be crossing. This Crossing is manned in the afternoon but not in the mornings.

The bright orange flags are highly visible. Road users are asked to be especially vigilant with the commencement of the school year. We urge all drivers, riders and pedestrians to be *alert* and move safely and carefully on and along the road.



#### P&C AGM

The Parents and Citizens Association is a vital supporting body of our school. Their aim is to promote the interests of the school by bringing parents, citizens, pupils and teaching staff into close co-operation. They assist in providing equipment required by the school, subsidising excursions and school programs and providing financial assistance for staffing where needed. **Please consider coming along to their AGM on Tuesday 14<sup>th</sup> February commencing at 7pm** in the VC room adjacent to the office. They meet twice a term, Week 3 and Week 7, and would welcome any new members.

#### **School Gates**

Parents and community members may have noticed that entry gates into the school have been fitted with a chain and clip lock. This arrangement is necessary as part of an individual Student Safety Plan. Gates must be secured with the clips at all times. Your support in this matter is vital and greatly appreciated.
