#### **NAPLAN ON-LINE**

We will participate in a school readiness test this week on <u>Tuesday.</u> It is important that your child attends to participate in this test.

The school readiness test is a 'practice run' for schools to assess their technology ahead of NAPLAN Online. The readiness test is not an assessment of student ability. The readiness test allows schools to:

- become familiar with the NAPLAN Online test format and processes
- check whether they have the technical capacity, rooms and devices to administer NAPLAN Online
- provide students in NAPLAN years 3, 5, 7 and 9 with the opportunity to experience the online test question types and format by completing a practice NAPLAN online test.

#### **Attendance Matters!**

As part of my job, it is my role to ensure students attend school every possible. Our school must improve attendance. A number of students have unsatisfactory attendance. Please aware that students will now receive a letter home about unexplained absences as this is the law and Department of Education Policy.

Everyday counts. Attendance patterns are established early - a child regularly missing days in kindergarten or in the early years of school will often continue to miss classes in the later years, and their achievement is often below that of their classmates. It's vital that students go to school every day - even in the early years of primary school.

There is no safe number of days for missing school - each day a student misses puts the behind, and can affect their educational outcomes. Each missed day is associated with progressively lower achievement in numeracy, writing and reading. Going to school every day is the single most important part of your child's education. Students learn new things at school every day - missing school puts them behind. We want our students to succeed and to do so they need to come regularly and on time. The single most important thing you can do for your child is to send them to school. School is the doorway to future success in all aspects of life.
