


K/1's Mass Investigations


When learning about Mass this Term, K/1 discovered that it takes more lighter items to balance a heavy one.

Working in pairs, students moved around 7 'Investigation Stations', carefully placing items into the balance pans until they were equal. They had to record results at each station so that we could compare our findings at the end of the session.
