The Grampians Excursion

Report Year 3-6

During the last week of last term, Year 3–6 attended an excursion to The Grampians. Over the 4 days we had an amazing time and learnt so much about the environment, ecosystems, native animals, animal adaptations and Aboriginal culture. Students are currently drafting their excursion reports that will be published in the WONGI later throughout the term.



With an early start on Monday morning, the Grampians excursion had begun. We knew we were close to arriving at our destination when we could just see the outline of the mountain range. After traveling through the winding roads we arrived at our first destination, McKenzie Falls. We embarked on the steep decent to the bottom of the falls, where we sat and listened to the roaring of the waterfall. With our tummies grumbling for lunch it was time to endure the incredibly steep and challenging journey back to the top. What a way to start our excursion! Our next stop was to Brambuk National Park and Cultural Centre, where we learnt about Aboriginal culture, including the dreamtime story of how the Grampians were formed. With the help of our guide we were able to create our

own Aboriginal stories by using traditional methods of painting symbols onto boomerangs.



We started the next day with 6km hike up Picaninny Mountain (Bainggug) that looked towards Mount Abrupt. The views from the top were spectacular!









We continued our adventurous 2 days at the Grampians retreat, by participating in team building obstacles, facing our fears on the giant swing and zipline, building shelters from natural materials, giggling our way through the low ropes course, singing around a camp fire, searching on nature walks and peddling on an 8km mountain bike ride. It was fantastic!





As our excursion came to an end we had one last destination to visit on the way home, Halls Gap Zoo! It was breath taking! We experienced the opportunity to hold an olive python called Oscar, cuddle friendly dingos, pat free roaming deer, get a photo with a wombat and view amazing creatures from all around the world. included American Bison. African Some Cheetahs, Shetland ponies, fennec foxes, Madagascan monkeys and lemurs. Our tour guide discussed the endangered animals, animal adaptions and different habitats, which related to our Science and Geography learning.
