

Technology Classes

Miss Schupfer and I both attended professional learning session yesterday in Melbourne at The Australian Centre for the Moving Image, at Federation Square. We learnt many skills that we are looking forward to developing further so we can run some animation classes with the students in the future. It is very exciting and we are looking forward to teaching other teachers how to produce an animated film. Our first step is to equip ourselves with the proper equipment and create a space for this to happen. We have also ordered new ipads for various projects, but we will be able to use these for our film making too. In our school plan, our aim to help improve students digital skills and set up the infrastructure for students to have the opportunity to develop digital skills across the curriculum. Learning to make an animated film is just another way we plan to do this.





In Term 3, we will also be teaching a Coding and Robotics program. The Department of Education have STEAM share kits we can book and use. During Term 1, I booked kits for our students to use. Moulamein Public School are always building on our programs and our staff are looking forward to providing these technological challenges and classes in the future. K/1 students will be learning to use Bee Bots, Year 2/3 will be learning how to use Dash Robots and Year 4/5/6 will have the opportunity to use Bluebots.



News From Mrs Mertz

Year 2 and 3 conducted a short experiment today to see if they could work out why spiders don't stick to their webs. They were given a mini web made from sticky tape and asked to walk their fingers over it. They discovered that the web stuck to them. Then they dipped their fingers in oil and walked over the sticky tape again. This time their fingers didn't stick.

What we discovered is that spiders have a special chemical on their legs which is a bit like oil that prevents them from sticking to their webs.
