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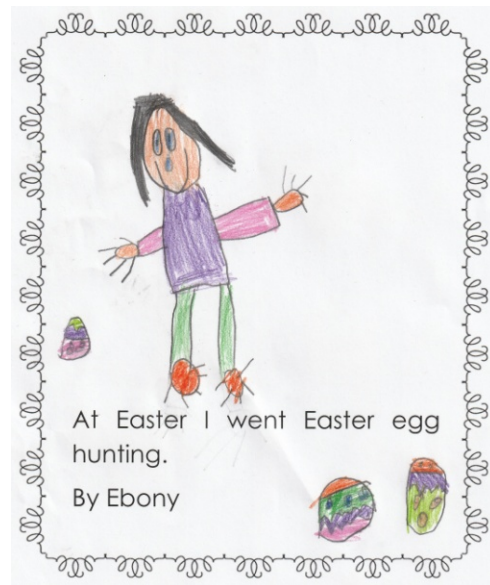
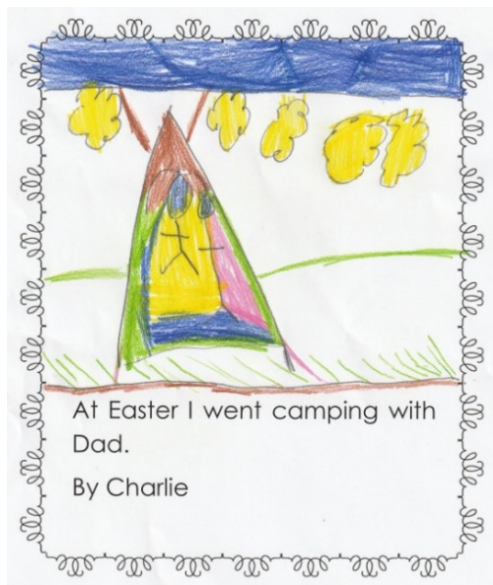
## Year 6 Shirt Presentation

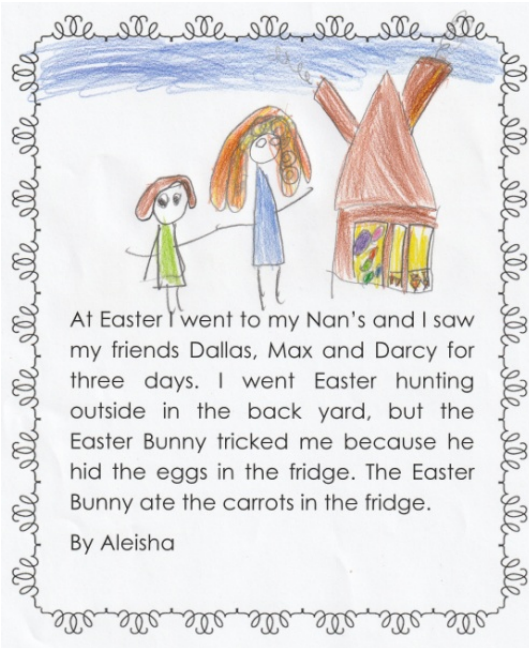
Year 6 students were presented with their shirts yesterday by P&C President, Mrs Rebecca Gray. The P&C Association kindly provide the shirts for students each year.

Students started Term 2 by talking about what they did at Easter. After sharing their news with a partner, they then completed some independent writing. Here are their published pieces:





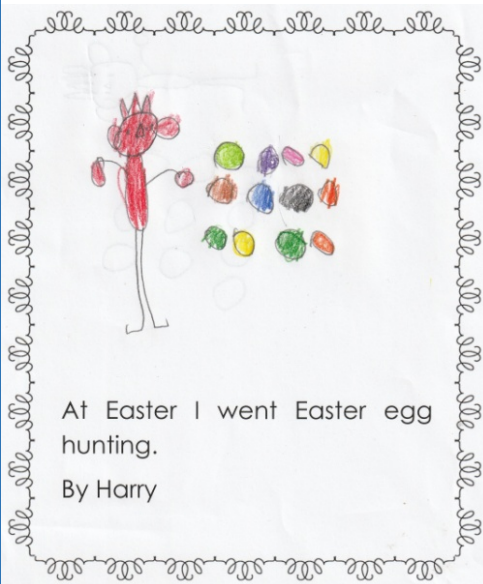

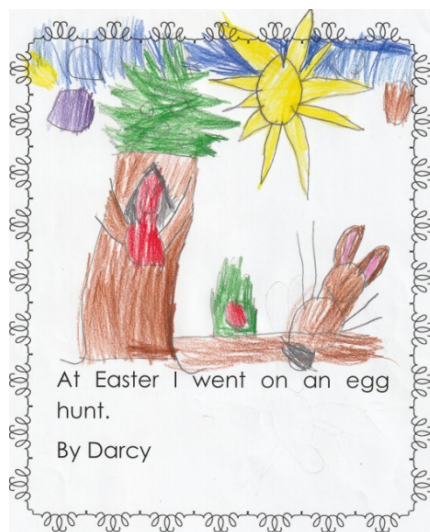
