Road Safety for drop off and collecting children from school

Always drop-off and pick-up your children from our school's designated areas, following our school's Road Safety procedures with care and courtesy.

These procedures include:

- <u>always using the designated School Crossing</u> to move from one side of the road to the other and on drop off and pick up.
- ~ waiting outside the school gate in Brougham Street to collect students as they are dismissed by the duty teacher. Do not call students out of the gate or across the road. Please use the school crossing to move to your vehicle on the other side of the road.
- waiting outside the school boundary fence in the bus area, if unexpectedly collecting a bus traveler. Students will only be dismissed to you once the buses have moved away. Please do not walk students between or around buses.
