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Principal's Messages

A few reminders:

- **School uniform** must be worn each day. Black track pants and jeans are not part of the uniform.
- **Footwear-** Students must not wear long boots or dirty farm boots to school. We will ask parents to bring in an appropriate pair of shoes next term if they are wearing these to school.
- School grounds are a non-smoking area, this includes the parking bays. We
 have a build-up of cigarette butts around our school. Legally you must smoke
 at least 4 metres away from our school boundaries.
- Please use the crossing to cross the road with your children in the morning.
 If you cross at the incorrect spot, children will mimic this behaviour when alone leaving them in a dangerous situation.
- Jumpers and hats must have names on them, so they can be returned to your child. Some names have worn off jumpers.
- **School excursions** must be paid for prior to the event, otherwise students cannot attend. This is the responsibility of parents to follow payments up and not the responsibility of office staff.
- Arrival Times- Students are turning up before teachers some days and this is increasing. You cannot legally send your child to school this early. There is no supervision for students who at this time and therefore are unsafe. The recommended time to arrive is 8.45am.
- End of day arrangements- please notify our school office with any changes for safety purposes.
