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Principal's Messages- COVID-19 – New Challenges for everyone

From today, NSW parents are urged to keep their children at home to minimise the spread of COVID-19 virus. The schools in NSW will remain open for parents who are unable to provide alternative arrangements for their children for parents who work in our health system, education system and emergency services. Parents are being supported in their choice to keep their children at home and this will not impact their personal or our overall school attendance rate.

Schools will be operating very differently and teachers will be providing work that can be completed at home. Students will be able to access on-line learning activities (but not necessary for those students who cannot access the internet) as well as packages which teachers will put together over the coming day for continued learning. The learning that will take place in a home environment will match classroom work for those students who attend school. The same package of work will be completed on school grounds and within the home. Classes and regular timetables will therefore no longer run as normal.


Donation to Moulamein Heritage Centre
