We have chosen a theme for the 5/6 room, Kindness. To support this, we have a lot of motivational posters around the room, one of the favourite sayings is


'Just one kind word can change someone's entire day.'


We also painted small stones with images or sayings that represented kindness to us. These stones will be placed in the quadrangle area very soon.





Literacy


