Year 3/4 News

In Year 3/4 this term, we have enjoyed learning about the different ways we can break apart a text. The class has enjoyed taking part in 'reciprocal reading' during our reading groups. 'Reciprocal reading' allows all students to be collaboratively involved in the questioning and exploration of a novel or text. The students enjoyed leading the groups and bouncing ideas off each other, enabling them to look at the text from different perspectives.









In Creative Arts this term, Year 3/4 have been appreciating the chance to let their imaginations flourish through drama. We have been looking at improvisation, miming and embracing characters. The students portrayed a character of their choosing in a short group play, making sure to include their expressions, their feelings and their personalities. I really enjoyed seeing all of the students have a go, with each character adding a new layer to the improvised plays.





In robotics 3/4 have thrived, relishing the chance to create their own machines to serve a purpose. They have begun to use different actions when coding, including sensors, tilting and motion. I am very impressed with the creations they have produced.
