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Check-in assessment for Years 4-6

Year 4 and Year 6 students will participate in a reading and numeracy Check-in assessment. The Check-in assessment is a NSW Department of Education online reading and numeracy assessment available to support schools to assess and monitor student learning. The assessments can supplement existing school practices to identify how students are performing and to help teachers tailor their teaching more specifically to student needs. The assessment will be scheduled for our students during Term1 Week 8-10.

NAPLAN Practice Tests

Students are expected to participate in the NAPLAN practice tests to ensure our school is ready for the transition to online testing. NAPLAN practice window opens this week and students will have the opportunity to visit the online platform to develop and understand how the platform works. Students in Year 3 and 5 will participate over the next few weeks when we have extra staffing available. The actual NAPLAN testing period is next term.

Rural Aid Organisation

Our school has applied to receive support from Rural Aid and we have been accepted to join their program. Rural Aid offers free, confidential counselling to Rural Aid registered farmers and their family. Rural Aid counsellors catch up with their farmers where they're most comfortable; whether it's on farm, in town, or over the phone. Rural Aid counsellors are professionally trained to support their clients through all kinds of life challenges and come with an understanding of the unique needs of rural people. They can support with practical strategies to help farmers refocus and get back on track. Counsellors will be coming to school and delivering a program, based on strategies of how to reduce anxiety and improve wellbeing. They are experienced in helping students do this and we will invite our families to attend workshops as well. We are working on creating strength in students and strategies on how to have great mental health. I am very pleased that we applied and have been accepted. It is expected that trained counsellors will join our team in Term 3 this year and students will participate in workshops designed for them. The program also involves counsellors revisiting the school to support students until the end of the year.
