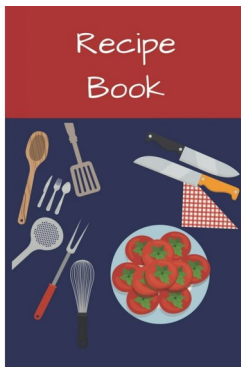
Principal Message

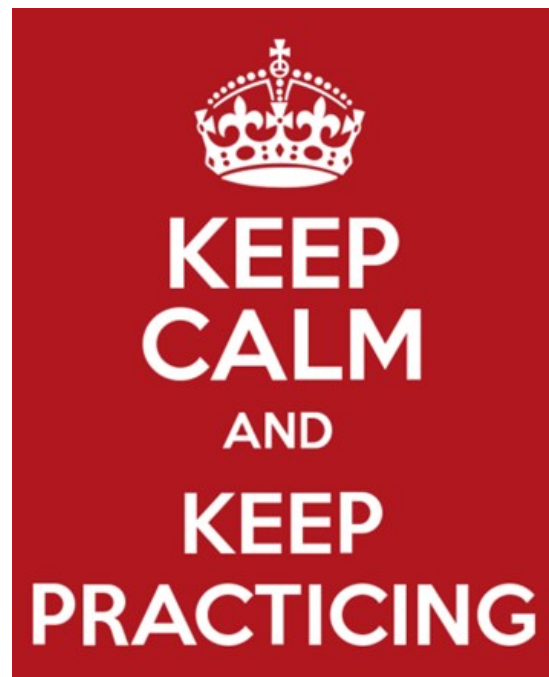


Presentation Day & Performance- Please note change of date

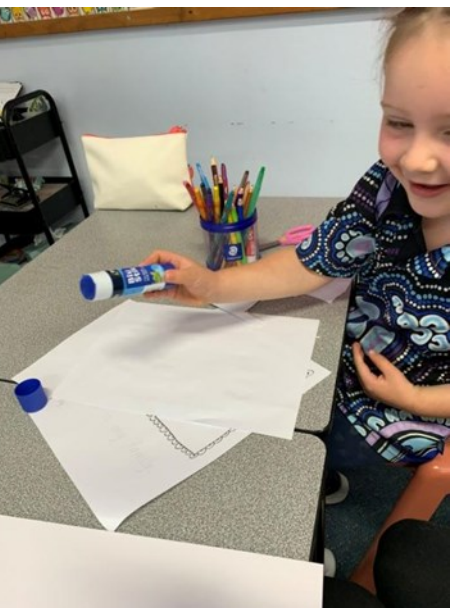


Lunchtime Fun with our police bikes!
