# What's been happening in K/1/2

Well, what a start it's been! It's hard to believe we are almost through Term I already. We have not stopped.

Our new Kindergarten students have settled in wonderfully – it's a difficult transition from Pre-School to School and they have done so well. Our Year I & 2 students have returned to the same classroom but with a fresh new look (so they don't feel like they're in the same classroom). Whilst we are all in the same room for the most part of the day, we have the luxury of an attached space to run our literacy groups. We are so fortunate to have Barney (SLSO) in our classroom Monday to Thursday –we'd be lost without her.

As a whole class group, we've read "The Wild Guide to Starting School" and "Whoever You Are", comparing the similarities and differences between ourselves and our school and schools around the world. We are looking at narratives and their features and the different techniques authors use to engage the reader. We are in the process of writing our own version of "A Dark, Dark Tale" using the repetitive pattern that the author uses. This links nicely with our Maths topic and the shape, number and patterns in the environment that we have been working on in Maths. We are about to learn about symmetry and have a go at creating our own mandalas with pattern blocks and natural materials from the garden. The kindergarten students have been busy learning new sounds and sight words and are beginning to write their own sentences with support.

In Geography we are learning about weather and seasons and how the weather and seasons impact us. We know that the weather and seasons are different in different parts of the world and where we can find information about the weather. We've also learned some interesting facts about weather. Did you know that it has rained fish and jellyfish in Australia and alligators in America?

In Science, we have been learning about Living Things with Mrs Mertz.

We are using The Resilience Project for Personal Development, with a focus on gratitude, empathy and mindfulness. These are very important for building resilience and a deeper understanding of one and other and the impact our actions can have on others. This week we learned about oxytocin-the happy hormone and how it is released in our brain when we do kind things for others. It's been lovely to see some of our students demonstrating empathy, gratitude and mindfulness when others are not feeling so great.

We are enjoying teaching your little people and look forward to a great end to Term I
