## YEAR 3/4 NEWSLETTER

Well, this term has flown by! Year 3 / 4 has had an exceptional start to the term, and we have settled into our classroom routines and expectations. We have been exploring narrative structures and features, with some great writing samples produced throughout the term. Along with this, we have been working hard with spelling and reading this term.

In Numeracy we have been developing our whole number skills through number talks, along with our addition and subtraction abilities. We have also been working with measurement, where we measured items in the classroom.

In Science, we have looked at materials and their properties and conducted an experiment to see which material would be the best to create a ball from. We have also learned about the importance of environments, learning about how rainforests help us, and how we can help it.

It's been a busy and engaging start, and I am extremely proud of the kids for settling in so well. I'm not sure where this came from, but their determination to march in unison in lines has become a constant sight around the school after break times. We have had lots of interesting conversations as a class, and there are lots of curious minds in here.

# Keeping safe during the school holidays



SCHOOL'S

School holidays are a time for children to take a break from their daily routines, and spend it with families and friends.

#### Parents and families play the most crucial role as a child's first teacher.

By the pre-teen years, many children are starting to become increasingly independent wanting to do more things without their parents and/or carers around.

Use the holidays as an opportunity to talk with and show your child how to be a safe pedestrian, rider and passenger. This **upskilling** will support them as their need for independence increases. Talk to your children about safe places to play. Highlight the risks and challenges in different neighbourhoods and traffic environment differences when on holidays.

Consider independent activities your child might do in the holiday period and how you can help to make it safer.

#### Messages to share with your children when they're out and about:

- · they always tell you/an adult when and where they are going
- if feeling unsafe, tell someone and move to somewhere safer
- avoid playing near driveways and carparks as drivers may not see them
- check their bike's brakes, bell, reflectors and tyres are all working before going for a ride
- · correctly wear a helmet when riding any device
- remove their headphones when near traffic so they can hear approaching vehicles
- stop, look, listen, think before they cross the road, and not just follow their friends
- wear bright clothing so drivers can see them, especially when it's twilight.
