Kindergarten Enrolment Information for 2026

We are accepting enrolments for Kindergarten students eligible to begin in 2026. Children can be enrolled in Kindergarten at the start of the school year if they reach five years of age on or before the 31st of July in that year. If you know anyone - friends, neighbours, or local families - with children who are ready to begin school next year, kindly inform them to contact the school for more details and start the online application enrolment process. School Bus Route Name and Number Changes

As part of a state-wide program, bus route names and numbers are being amended so they can become part of a standardised system. These changes have been made to the Moulamein School Bus Routes. Note that these are route name/number changes only. Physical routes along which the bus travels have not changed.

Old Number and Name: N2586	Moulamein-Murgha-Windouran
New Number and Name:S938	Pretty Pine Rd & Balranald Rd to Moulamein Public
Old Number and Name: N2587 New Number and Name:S939	Moulamein Special Moulamein Rd and Swan Hill Rd to Moulamein Public

Transport Connected Bus Program (TCB)

The Moulamein School Buses are now part of the TCB Program that includes regular routes and school bus routes. This means you can log onto an app and see the bus route, timetable, and where the bus is in real time. There are many apps that you can use. One that seems to work well in rural areas is Any Trip, but there are several you could try. If you have any questions about the TCB Program, you can contact the local bus operators, Wayne and Andrea Davies, on 0431 593 155. Below are some Frequently Asked Questions and Answers put together by Transport for NSW.

What are the benefits of the TCB Program for customers?

As part of the TCB Program, customers travelling in rural and regional centres that have the TCB Technology available will be able to:

- view reliable timetable information and real-time trip updates using the Transport for NSW Trip Planner tool, the Opal Travel app and other third-party public transport travel apps
- view interactive maps for each route, the full timetable and service updates at transportnsw.info
- view real-time updates on bus location and predicted arrival time at a stop; and
- view an indication of bus occupancy.

Which websites and apps can customers view the real-time updates for services in areas that have the TCB Technology installed?

Customers will be able to view timetable and real-time updates for regular and school services on:

- Transport for NSW Trip Planner tool at transportnsw.info
- Opal Travel app
- the Transport bot on Facebook Messenger, Google Assistant and Amazon Alexa; and
- popular third-party public transport apps. Note: A list of apps is available at transportnsw.info/apps.

What information will customers see on real-time travel apps and the transportnsw.info website when real-time data is unavailable e.g., when the vehicle is in an area where there is no network coverage?

If real-time data is not available:

- 1. Third-party travel apps and transportnsw.info will show only the scheduled timetable.
- 2. An indication of vehicle occupancy will not be displayed.
- 3. The real-time icon will not appear, and a message will indicate "no real-time data".

Note: While "black spots" may be frequent in regional areas and particularly in remote areas, the amount of network coverage required to send real-time trip updates is small i.e., less than what is required to make a phone call. Intermittent realtime updates provide customers with a better picture of where a bus is rather than no information at all.

Will TfNSW publish stop location information for all school pick up locations?

Yes, all stop locations will be visible on transportnsw.info and third-party travel apps.

Will the automatic passenger counter sensor be recording or storing any video or photos of passengers? Is there a public privacy concern?

No, the passenger count is recorded using infrared sensors to detect a passenger boarding or alighting the bus. The infrared imagery is not stored anywhere once the passenger count has been recorded.

This term we are looking at Informative texts, and we have been learning all about the Solar System. We have been working on writing information reports about Jupiter and using diagrams.




In Mathematics this week we have started looking at position and maps, where we will be designing our own treasure maps.


We have also created some wonderful art with Mrs Mertz which was inspired by Charkes McGee.
