## **K12 STEM Projects**

STEM A

STEM is based on the idea of educating students in four specific disciplines — science, technology, engineering and mathematics — in an interdisciplinary and applied approach. Rather than teach the four disciplines as separate subjects, STEM integrates them into a cohesive learning paradigm based on real-world applications and problem solving.



K12 are completing a mini STEM Project each week of Term 4. They have thrived in the collaborative environment and are able to apply valuable real-life skills such as team work, thinking outside the square, designing, building, communicating ideas and critical thinking.

This week the STEM Project challenge was to build an Eiffel Tower from aluminium foil in

teams. It had to be over 1m tall, stand alone and hold the weight of 5 pegs.



After completing some research on the actual Eiffel Tower and the engineering feats it took to build it, students designed individual structures with labels on paper. They then worked in small groups and applied their knowledge to construct their tower as a team.







I was extremely impressed with the way students worked together, shared ideas and used problem solving to achieve their end goal.





I hope to share more of the STEM based learning projects the students will complete as the term progresses.
